

Preparing for an Occupational Therapy Evaluation

First, you will need a referral from your doctor in order for us to perform the occupational therapy evaluation. After the doctor writes a prescription:

- Call our Aiken office at **(803)-642-0700** or our Lexington office at **(803)-356-4782** to schedule an occupational therapy evaluation.
- Your child's evaluation will last approximately one hour.

What do I need to do before my child's physical therapy evaluation?

- It may be a good idea to arrange childcare for your other children so you can participate in the evaluation with your child without any distractions.
- Complete the patient intake form which can be found in the top right hand corner of our website or on the resources page of our website.
 - Please answer all questions as thoroughly as you possibly can.
 - If you do not know the answer to a question you can speak with your occupational therapist and they will help you to answer them.
 - Bring this form with you to the evaluation.
 - List any other concerns you have with your child and please bring them up to your occupational therapist so they can be properly addressed. Specifically, we want to hear about your concerns regarding your child's
 - Motor skills
 - Activities of daily living (dressing, grooming, feeding, etc.)
 - Behavior and play skills
- Bring these items with you to the evaluation
 - Any medical records or other therapy evaluations that may be relevant to your child's occupational therapy evaluation.
 - A list of any medications your child takes with the dosage and frequency that they take these medications.
 - Make sure you have a copy of your insurance card and driver's license so we can keep them on file.
 - Please make sure your child dresses in comfortable clothes to allow them to move easily.

What will my child's evaluation include?

- We will speak with you and your child about their medical history and specific difficulties to help determine the best course of treatment.
- We will perform an evaluation, which includes tests to learn more about the difficulties your child is having. More specifically, we will determine if you child is having problems in the following areas:
 - Sensory processing skills including:
 - Visual
 - Auditory
 - Tactile (how you child processes what he/she touches)
 - Vestibular (how your child processes themselves in motion)
 - Proprioceptive (how your child processes his actual movement)

- Activities of daily living (dressing, grooming, etc.)
- Motor planning and control including:
 - Coordination
 - Strength
- Self-regulation
- Visual-motor and visual-perceptual skills including:
 - Handwriting
 - Cutting with scissors
- Upper extremity use including:
 - Strength
 - Range of motion
 - Using both hands together

Our therapists will thoroughly address your child's needs. As a result, a follow-up appointment may be necessary. We will answer all additional questions you have and create a personalized plan-of-care for your child. Our therapist will recommend a frequency and duration for your child's therapy. Authorization may be needed from your insurance provider to schedule subsequent visits.
